Carnbee Birds



In January I decided to take part in the RSPB garden bird survey and recorded 15 species which visited my garden in Carnbee Park in a two hour slot one morning: Blackbird, Robin, Dunnock, Woodpigeon, Blue Tit, Great Tit, Long-tailed Tit, Goldfinch, Bullfinch, Greenfinch, Carrion Crow, Magpie, Treecreeper, Common (Mealy) Redpoll and Blackcap. Another 7 birds also come to the feeders or feed in my garden but were not seen during the census period - Starling, Great-spotted Woodpecker, Coal Tit, Wren, Chaffinch, Siskin and Feral Pigeon. All those species are resident, occurring throughout the year. Being a warbler, one would normally expect to see the Blackcap only in summer but it has been noted in the past thirty years or so that more Blackcaps are over-wintering in the UK, perhaps because of milder winters (and lots of people with bird feeders in their garden). They have decided they would rather stay in Edinburgh than go back to Africa!



Birds which have visited my garden only a handful of times in 15 years are House Sparrow, Song Thrush, Mistle Thrush, Tree Sparrow, Willow Warbler (summer) and Brambling (winter). All of these can be seen in Edinburgh in the appropriate season if you know where to go. The drastic reduction in House Sparrow numbers over the past twenty years is of great interest as they had earlier been virtually omnipresent throughout habited areas in the UK and they appear to be suffering from some sort of competition. This is surprising as they were thought to be extremely adaptable, perhaps the best example of this being the introduction of the House Sparrow to South America probably from ships at Buenos Aires from where they spread to the high Andes of Bolivia more than a thousand miles to the west and 11,000 feet altitude.

Other birds which I have seen in the Area 7 Woodland between Carnbee and Southfield House are Chiffchaff (summer), Collared Dove, Goldcrest, Pied Wagtail, Rook, Waxwing (winter), Fieldfare (winter) and Redwing (winter). The Chiffchaff has been a regular singer here at Carnbee this year and I do not remember hearing it much it at all in earlier years.

Birds seen flying over the estate are Herring Gull, Black-headed Gull, Common Gull, Sparrowhawk, Buzzard, Kestrel, Oystercatcher, Lesser Black-backed Gull (summer), Swallow (summer), Swift (summer), Pink-footed Goose (winter). The birds of prey are very unusual. To see the flocks of Pink-footed Goose flying over Carnbee can be a magnificent spectacle. Arriving from the arctic in October, they stay in Scotland until March, moving between feeding areas and roosts at Aberlady, Gladhouse Reservoir and other places in the region.
